

1. Pursuant to authority contained in paragraph 6, Army Regulations 600-45, the Soldier's Medal is awarded the following officer:

First Lieutenant Wilbur J. Vinson, 01289347, 323rd Inf, for heroism in the Tennessee Maneuver Area on 6 May, 1943. First Lieutenant Vinson, at or about 2100, 6 May, 1943, with utter disregard of his own safety, with difficulty succeeded in running down and mounting a run-away  $\frac{1}{4}$ -ton truck as it was gaining speed in a downhill dash through heavy underbrush and small trees and steered the truck into a tree, thereby receiving minor personal injuries. The actions of Lieutenant Vinson saved many enlisted men from serious injury and possible death as the driverless truck was traversing an area in which enlisted men were sleeping. This courageous action was in accord with the highest tradition of the military service. Entered Military service from North Carolina.

"b. Sub-guard No. 2.

Post No. 11 is at the sewage disposal plant. The sentry will patrol a course starting at the sewage disposal plant office extending around the guard barracks and the southern half of the sewage disposal plant and back to starting point, keeping all buildings to his left.

Post No. 12 is at the gate on Artillery Road 200 yards northeast of the intersection of Artillery Road and "M" Street. The sentry will be posted at the gate. His orders are as follows:

(1) Privately owned automobiles will not be permitted to enter or leave the cantonment area by this gate.

(2) Drivers of individual military vehicles, unless the vehicle contains an officer passenger, will be required to show a properly made out trip ticket before entering or leaving the cantonment area by this gate.

(3) Convoys of military vehicles will be passed in or out this gate without hindrance.

(4) A copy of these orders will be furnished each sentry when he is posted."

1. a. A Division Special Guard will be furnished by the following units in order named:

321st Infantry  
322nd Infantry  
323rd Infantry  
81st Division Artillery

b. Each unit will furnish the guard for a period of two weeks, relieving the unit preceding it at guard mount on alternate Wednesdays at the guardhouse of Sub-guard No. 1. The 321st Infantry, now furnishing the guard, will be relieved by the 322nd Infantry on December 23, 1942. The schedule as given above will be repeated each eight weeks.

2. a. The unit furnishing the guard will be responsible for police of guard barracks, pump houses, and the areas immediately surrounding each post.

b. Within four (4) hours after taking over the guard, any unit finding evidence of neglect or misuse of the guard barracks, or failure to police properly will report the facts to the Assistant Division Provost Marshal, who will immediately make an investigation and report his findings to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-1.

c. The Assistant Division Provost Marshal will be responsible for all property and equipment furnished for the use of the guard. The transfer of guard property and equipment from the old guard to the new guard will be supervised by the Assistant Division Provost Marshal at guard mount when responsibility for guard changes between units. At this transfer any defects in or evidence of misuse of guard property or equipment will be noted and the responsibility therefor fixed. The new officer of the guard will sign a temporary memorandum receipt for all guard property and equipment at this time; the memorandum receipt of the old officer of the guard will be returned. Transfers of guard property and equipment between officers of the guard of the same unit will be accomplished as directed by the unit commander.

3. The unit officer of the day will supervise this guard.

4. An officer of the guard, who will have no other duties during his tour of duty will be detailed for this guard, and will sleep at the guardhouse of Sub-guard No. 1.

5. The guard will consist of:

a. Sub-guard No. 1.

(1) one sergeant  
(2) three corporals  
(3) thirty privates  
(4) one  $\frac{1}{2}$ -ton weapons carrier, and two drivers.

b. Sub-guard No. 2.

(1) one sergeant  
(2) three corporals  
(3) six privates

c. General

(1) one  $\frac{1}{2}$ -ton truck (for officer of guard)

(2) other vehicles as needed to transport personnel, equipment and rations.

6. Guardhouses.

a. Sub-guard No. 1 - Guard barracks near ground reservoirs.  
 b. Sub-guard No. 2 - Guard barracks near office of sewerage disposal plant.

c. Post No. 1 - Pump House at Well No. 1.  
 d. Cossack Post No. 8 - Pump house at Well No. 8.

7. a. All posts will be guarded continuously.  
 b. When not engaged in official duties all members of the guard will remain in or in the immediate vicinity of their respective guardhouse.

8. a. Uniform: Drill "B", with arms.  
 b. Ammunition: To be issued when sentries are posted.

9. Unit furnishing the guard will supply meals, to be taken to the special guard barracks and posts as directed by the officer of the guard.

10. The following posts are established:

a. Sub-guard No. 1:

Post No. 1 is a post of one corporal and three privates at Well No. 1. The sentry will walk around the outside of the tank, keeping within twenty yards of the pump house.

Post No. 2 is at Well No. 2. The sentry will walk in front of the pump house, inside the fence.

Post No. 3 is at Well No. 2. The sentry will walk around the outside of the fence.

Post No. 4 is at Well No. 3. The sentry will walk a course approximately 20 yards long, parallel to, and about 25 yards in front of the pump house.

Post No. 5 is at Well No. 3. The sentry will walk around the pump house inside the fence.

Post No. 6 is at Well No. 4. The sentry will walk a course approximately 20 yards long, parallel to, and about 25 yards in front of the pump house.

Post No. 7 is at Well No. 4. The sentry will walk around the pump house inside the fence.

Post No. 8 is a post of one corporal and three privates at Well No. 5. The sentry will walk around the outside of the fence, keeping within 20 yards of the pump house.

Post No. 9 is at the ground reservoirs, and extends around the two reservoirs. The sentry will walk his post keeping the reservoirs to his left.

Post No. 10 is at the ground reservoirs. The sentry will walk a course about 20 yards long, parallel to the front of the pump house, inside the fence; the course starts at the fence gate and ends near the pump house door.

b. Sub-guard No. 2:

Post No. 11 is at the sewage disposal plant. The sentry will patrol a course around the southern half of the sewage disposal plant.

Post No. 12 is at the sewage disposal plant. The sentry will patrol a course around the plant office and sub-guard No. 2 barracks.

11. Special duties of the guard:

a. No persons, other than the commanding generals of the 81st Division

and Camp Rucker, members of the guard, and maintenance and inspection personnel authorized by a pass signed by the Camp Utilities Officer, will be admitted within the guarded areas. Any persons, other than those just excepted, found loitering or behaving suspiciously nearby will be apprehended and turned over to the officer of the guard for such action as he deems appropriate.

b. No person will be allowed to remove any equipment or supplies without leaving in the hands of a member of the guard a receipt bearing the signature and full identification of the person removing the equipment or supplies. Receipts will be turned over to the officer of the guard, who as soon as practicable after relief by the new officer of the guard will turn over to the Camp Utilities Office all receipts received during his tour.

c. Blackouts will be put into effect as quickly as practicable after the alarm is sounded. To make sure that signals are received by the guard the officer of the day of the unit furnishing the guard will notify both sub-guards by telephone of blackout and all clear signals.

12. Unit commanders will issue such additional orders as may be necessary to carry out the instructions contained herein.

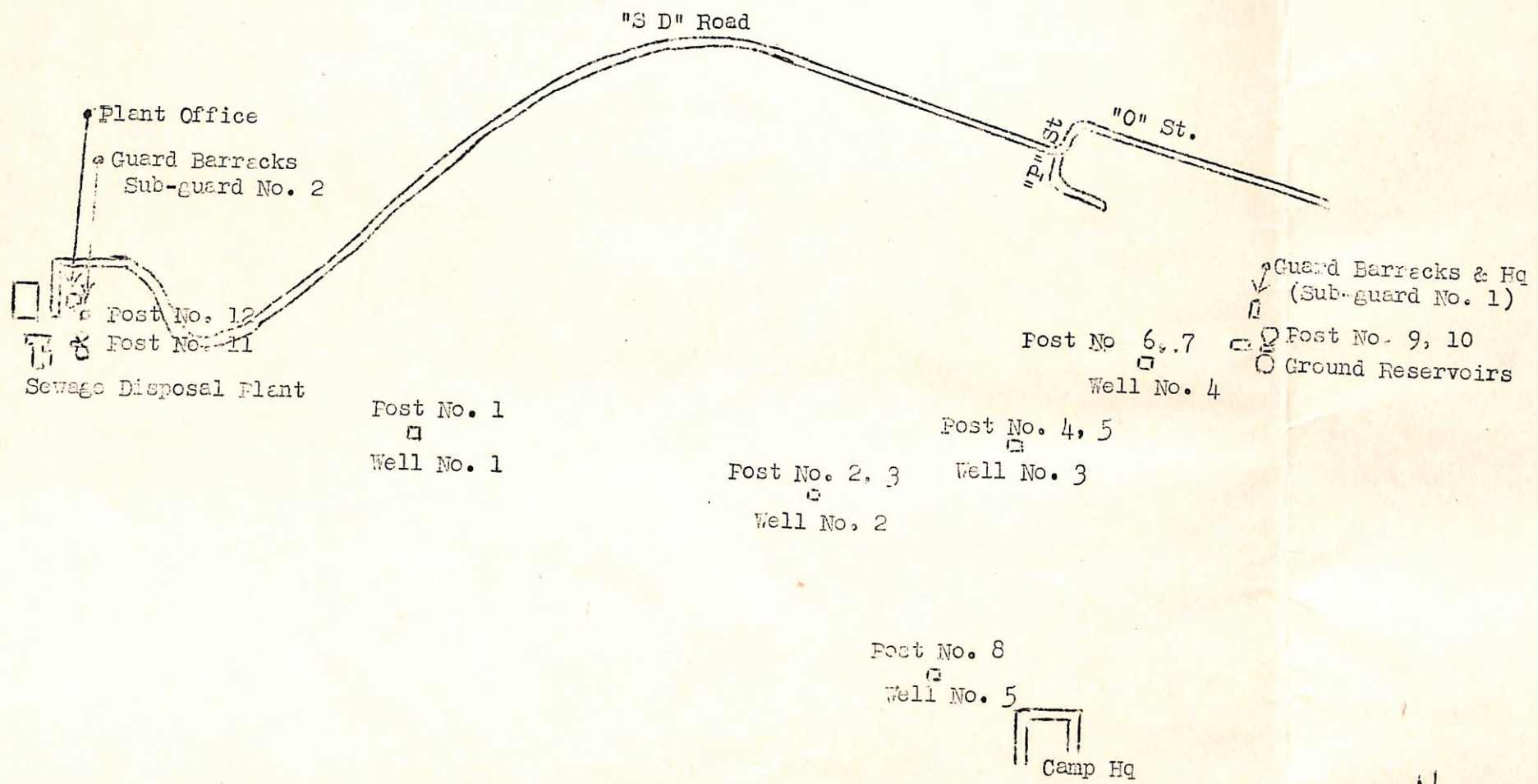

NUMBER 18 )

1. General Orders No. 3, cs, this headquarters and ammendment No. 1 thereto are rescinded.
2. Unit commanders are responsible for guarding their own areas. Sufficient armed guards will be detailed in motor parks to prevent sabotage, theft of parts and tools, and unauthorized use of vehicles. Guard in remainder of unit area will be ample for fire protection and safeguarding of Government property. Plans of unit guard and copies of orders relative thereto will be submitted to this headquarters.
3. a. Units of the 81st Infantry Division will furnish a Division Guard in accordance with schedules published in Special Orders.
- b. The Officer of the Day of the unit furnishing the Division Guard will make the necessary inspection of sentries posted on the Division Guard.
- c. Name and quarters number of the unit Officer of the Day going on duty will be reported in writing to Division Adjutant General 24 hours in advance. This will be posted in Adjutant General's Office for the information of the Duty Officer.
- d. Prisoner Guards as requested by the Division Provost Marshal will be furnished by the unit furnishing the Division Guard. Guards detailed for this duty will report for instruction to Division Provost Marshal (Bldg. 2711) daily at 0745. Uniform, Drill "B", under arms.

## 4. The following posts are established:

Post No. 1: This is a continuous armed guard posted inside building No. 203, and consists of a single sentry, except when the amount of funds on hand require it, the Division Finance Officer will request direct from the unit furnishing the Division Guard such additional sentries as may be necessary.

ORDERS POST NO. 1.

1. My post is in building #203.
2. During duty hours I will place myself as directed by the Division Finance Officer.
3. After duty hours my post will be in the west end of the lower hallway of building #203. When so posted I will prevent anyone, except properly identified Finance Office personnel, from entering the Finance Office or proceeding east of the stairway at the west end of the hallway. I will ascertain that lower hallway door at the east end of building #203 is locked. I will permit students to enter the west door and proceed to second floor school rooms via west stairway.
4. After duty hours I will prevent anyone other than the Division Finance Officer from tampering with the Finance Office safe.
5. During the hours of darkness I will make frequent inspections to determine that the light over the Finance Office safe is burning. If the light is not burning I will immediately call for the Corporal of the Guard.
6. In case of fire I will give the alarm.

Post No. 2: From retreat until reveille on week days, continuous on Sundays and holidays.

General Order No. 18, Hq 81st Inf Div, Nov 30, 1942. (continued)

ORDERS POST NO. 2.

1. This is post No. 2. It extends from the Post Office (Building #206), West to "P" Street, South on "P" Street to building #201, then East to CR at Northeast corner of Service Club (Building #207), then North to Chapel (Building #205) and return to Post Office.
2. I will inspect Buildings #201, 205 and 206, testing doors once each hour during my tour. I will also test the doors of the Service Club (Building #207) once each hour after activities have stopped for the night.
3. On each tour of my post I will enter Building #203 by the west door and ascertain that the light over the Finance Office safe is burning.
4. If any doors are found unlocked in any building or suspicious persons are found loitering around or seen in any building I will call the Corporal of the Guard. I will detain any suspicious person and turn such person over to the Officer of the Day for investigation.
5. In case of fire in any building I will awaken all occupants of the building and give the alarm by calling "Fire Post No. 2", and by personally reporting the fire to the Fire Station (Building #2302) 75 yards West of Division Headquarters.
6. If the light in the Post Office Building is not burning or goes out I will call for the Corporal of the Guard.

Post No. 3: Posted at 81st Inf Div Post Office at times request by the Division Postal Officer. This post will normally consist of a single sentry, but will be double sentry post when the Postal Officer makes request on the unit furnishing guard.

ORDERS POST NO. 3.

1. My post is No. 3. It is in the Post Office until the close of business and the building has been locked. My post then extends around the Post Office Building keeping it on my left.
2. I will make frequent inspections of the doors while I am walking my post to insure that they are locked at all times. If any door is found unlocked or the light in the Post Office goes out I will call for the Corporal of the Guard.
3. I will arrest all suspicious persons found loitering around or attempting to enter the Post Office and turn them over to the Officer of the Day.
4. In case of fire I will give the alarm by calling "Fire Post No. 3" but I will remain on my post.
5. Guard Mount. Informal Guard Mount will be held daily in area of unit furnishing Division Guard. Time of Guard Mount as listed in General Order No. 14, Headquarters 81st Infantry Division, dated October 26, 1942.
6. Military Police.
  - a. The Division Provost Marshal will dispatch a Military Police Patrol at irregular hours to cover designated routes.
  - b. A Military Policeman will be on duty from 0700 to 1700 in front of Division Headquarters Building. His post will extend across the front of the building. He will scrutinize all arrivals and will cause all civilians to state their business before allowing them to enter. Should their business authorize them to enter, the sentry will direct the visitor to report to Message Center; Message Center personnel will conduct visitors to proper office.
  - c. Between 1700 and 0700 weekdays and all day Sundays and holidays, a Military Police will be posted in entry hall of Division Headquarters Building. This guard will not permit any person including officers to enter the main portion of headquarters building unless he recognizes the officer as a Division Staff Officer, unless an enlisted man has a pass signed by the Division Adjutant General, or the visitor is identified and passed by the Duty Officer.

d. The Military Police will be especially alert for calls from sentries on the Division Guard during hours these sentries are posted. When posted during hours sentries are posted he will ascertain the unit furnishing the Division Guard and the telephone number of the Officer of the Day. Upon hearing a call from any sentry of the Division Guard he will immediately notify the Officer of the Day by telephone and will also inform the Division Headquarters Duty Officer of the facts.

7. Enlisted men on duty at Division Headquarters who are authorized by their Chiefs of Section to work in headquarters after duty hours will be furnished with a permanent pass which will bear the signature of the soldier to whom issued, and be signed by the Division Adjutant General. This pass will be presented to the Military Policeman on duty, at the time of entering the headquarters building.

8. Officers reporting in for duty or as inspectors will be required to sign the Officers' Register and to identify themselves by both official orders and Officers' Identification Card. During duty hours they will be conducted to the Adjutant General by Message Center personnel. After duty hours these officers will be conducted to the Duty Officer. No officer, unknown to the personnel authorized to grant entrance to headquarters building, will be accepted simply on the strength of wearing uniform and insignia.





3. The following posts are established and will be posted until further instructions.

Orders Post #2.

1. This is Post #2. It extends from the Post Office (Building #206), West to P Street, South on P Street to Building #201, then East to CR at Northeast corner of Service Club (Building #207), then North to Chapel (Building #205) and return to Post Office.
2. I will inspect Buildings #201, 203, 205, and 206, testing the doors once each hour during my tour. I will also test the doors of the Service Club (Building #207) once each hour after activities have stopped for the night.
3. If any doors are found unlocked in any building or suspicious persons are found loitering around or seen in any building I will call "Military Police Post #2." I will detain any suspicious person and turn such person over to the officer of the day for investigation.
4. In case of fire in any building I will awaken all occupants of the building and give the alarm by calling "Fire Post No. 2," and by calling Telephone No. ~~333~~ Ring 2 or by personally reporting the fire to the Fire Station (Building #2302) 75 yards W of Division Headquarters. I will give the alarm by the most rapid of these means.
5. If the light in the Post Office is not burning or goes out I will report the fact to the officer of the day.

Post No. 3: Posted at 81st Inf Div Post Office at times requested by the Division Postal Officer. The post normally will consist of a single sentry but will be a double sentry post when the Postal Officer makes requests on the unit furnishing guard as listed in Par. 2 a.

1. My post is No. 3. It is in the Post Office until the close of business and the building has been locked. My post then extends around the Post Office building keeping it to my left.

5. Prisoners. For minor offenses men will not be placed in confinement. They will be turned over to their organizations with a delinquency report. Prisoners sentenced by special or summary courts may be confined in unit guard houses, subject to the provisions of Administrative Memorandum No. 3, Headquarters 81st Infantry Division Cadre, dated 8 June 1942.

6. Military Police. The Division Provost Marshal will dispatch military police motor patrol at irregular hours to cover designated routes.

7. An armed guard will be on duty from 0700 until 1700 in front of the Headquarters building. His post will extend across the front of building. He will scrutinize all arrivals and will cause all civilians to state their business before allowing them to enter. Should their business authorize

them to enter, the sentry will direct the visitor to report to Message Center. Message Center personnel will conduct visitors to proper office.

8. Between 1700 and 0700 weekdays and all day on Sundays and Holidays, an armed guard will be posted in entry hall of Division Headquarters Building. This guard will not permit any person including officers to enter the main portion of headquarters building unless he recognizes the officer as a division staff officer or the person is identified and passed by the Duty Officer. In case of a call "Military Police Post No \_\_\_", the duty officer will be informed at once.

9. Enlisted men on duty at Division Headquarters who are authorized by their commanding officer, or chief of section to work in headquarters after duty hours will be furnished with a permanent pass which will bear the signature of the soldier to whom issued, and be signed by the Division Adjutant General. This pass will identify him to Message Center clerk or to sentry on duty.

10. Officers reporting in for duty or as inspectors will be required to sign the officers register and to identify themselves by both official orders and Officers' Identification Card. During duty hours they will be conducted to the Adjutant General by Message Center personnel. After duty hours these officers will be conducted to the duty officer. No strange officer will be accepted simply on the strength of wearing uniform and insignia.

2. Telephones are located in all headquarters buildings, the Finance Office (9401) and the guard house.

3. Sentries will be provided with ball ammunition. Between retreat and reveille sentries will prevent any unauthorized persons from entering or loitering in motor parks and will turn any persons violating this provision over to an NCO of the guard.

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#2. Starting at corner of G Street and GH-4 Street, W to GH-5 Street, S to AT Street, E. to GH-4 Street then N. to starting point.

#3. Starting at SE corner of Bldg 7702 S. along W. side of line of parked trucks then N. to starting point keeping line of trucks to the left at all times.

#4. Starting at entrance to concrete parking lot S. along W. side of 133rd Truck Co. vehicles, W. to end of Artillery vehicle park, E. to end of line of trucks then N. to starting point keeping all vehicles to the left.

FIRE ORDER

The following instructions covering Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting, are issued to govern procedure within the 81st Division area during occupancy of temporary area and pending the issuance of Post General Orders covering this subject.

SECTION I

Organization

The Headquarters Commandant is designated as Division Fire Marshall in addition to other duties. The Artillery Commander, Infantry Regimental Commanders and the senior officer of the Division Special troops will appoint area Fire Marshall, and Ass't Fire Marshall, who will be responsible for the organization of fire prevention and fire fighting within their respective area.

Company "C", 775th TD Bn. is designated as Fire Company for the Division area.

SECTION II

Territorial Organization

The area temporary occupied by the 81st Division will be divided for Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting purposes as follows:

- 321st Area, Bldgs 8 - 17 incl. Block 7800
- 322nd Area, Bldgs 1 - 7 incl. & Bldg 18 Block 7800
- 323rd Area, Bldgs 9 - 17 incl. Block 7900
- Arty. Area, Bldgs 1 - 4 & 14 - 19 incl. Block 7600
- Special Troops Area Bldgs 5 - 13 incl. Block 7600
- Q.M. Area Bldgs 1 - 19 incl Block 7500.

SECTION III

Duties

Area Fire Marshall:

The Area Fire Marshall will organize the Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting system within his area.

He will be responsible for the inspection and the elimination of fire hazards within his area.

He will conduct Fire drill at least twice per month, to insure that the personnel are properly trained. First drill will be held in each area for area's personnel within 4 days after receipt of this order.

He will make a weekly check of all stoves in operation to detect and eliminate at once fire hazard observed.

He will act as the assistant to the Division Fire Marshall and carry out his orders.

Organization of Fire Company:

Temporarily, Company C, 775th TD Bn. will act as Division Fire Company.

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The Fire Company will be brought without delay to the scene of any fire occurring within the temporary Division area and there held in formation to await instructions from Fire Marshall.

Employment:

Normally the Fire Company will be employed by the area Fire Marshall under direction of Fire Marshall or Fire Chief for the purpose of policing roads, evacuating personnel and material, watching adjacent roofs and buildings for spread of fire and in the absence of the professional Fire Department to fight fire or in any other manner required by the Fire Marshall.

In addition to the Fire Company each area Fire Marshall will organize a bucket brigade within his area of sufficient size to handle such fire buckets or extinguishers as may be made available to him. These units will be moved without delay to the scene of any fire within the Division area and reported to the Fire Marshall.

SECTION IV

Fire Alarms

Fire alarms will be reported to Telephone 87 and the following instructions will be carried out:

(a) The person discovering a fire will give the alarm by shouting FIRE! He will then run to the nearest telephone and call the operator saying "#87 I want to report a fire". As soon as the call is answered, he will report as follows "There is a fire in building # \_\_\_\_\_ on \_\_\_\_\_ Street between \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ Streets". He must make sure that the Fire Department has the correct location of the fire before hanging up.

The person giving the alarm will then station himself on the road ready to flag down the apparatus and direct them to the fire.

The Officer of the Day will at once dispatch one relief of the Guard to the scene of the fire to report to the Fire Marshall or Fire Chief. The remainder of the guard will remain at the Guard house. Men on post will continue to walk their posts.

The Division Surgeon will dispatch an ambulance with medical personnel and first-aid equipment to report to the Fire Marshall for duty.

SECTION V

Dissemination of Order

The contents of this order will be read and explained to all military personnel at the earliest opportunity after its receipt.

A copy will be kept posted on each Company Bulletin Board.

Area Commanders will submit names, office and quarters Building numbers of designated Area Fire Marshals and Ass't Fire Marshals to Division Headquarters.

The names of the Area Fire Marshall and Ass't Fire Marshall will be posted on Company Bulletin Boards.
